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ANNUAL HOMELAND SECURITY SUMMIT COVID-19 PROTECTION PROCESSES AND PROTOCOLS

The health and safety of attendees is our top priority, and the Secure Community Network (SCN) is fully engaged and ready to implement the safeguards necessary to welcome attendees in Washington, DC during the Annual Homeland Security Summit from Monday, 8 November through Wednesday, 10 November 2021.

The FDA has determined that COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective in reducing the likelihood of serious illness and death caused by COVID-19, including the Delta variant. As we plan for a successful annual meeting in Washington, DC, we will continue to monitor federal, state, and local guidance and COVID-19 trends, including models from the Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation.

The following COVID-19 protocols will apply to all attendees traveling to Washington, DC:

- Attendees traveling to Washington, DC, must be fully vaccinated prior to attending the annual meeting, and will be required to present proof of vaccination status.
- Regardless of vaccination status, attendees will be required to submit to a COVID test(s) on November 8, 2021, at the Summit, and use INSTApass to complete such forms, consents, and authorizations as the test provider deems necessary. Such test(s) will be administered as part of the check-in process, and by attending attendee is agreeing to sign a consent form authorizing the test administrator to: (a) conduct the applicable COVID test(s) (which COVID test(s) will be listed in the consent form); (b) collect, copy, share, use and transmit attendee's COVID test(s) results and related personal information through INSTApass or through other means as it determines is necessary; (c) share such information with SCN; (d) transmit the attendee's COVID test(s) results to attendee's user account with INSTApass, Novir's app; and (e) complete such other documentation as the test administrator reasonably requires.
- Regardless of vaccination status, while in Washington, DC, attendees will be required to adhere to Washington D.C. mask requirements, and those of each separate venue, should they wish to participate in activities in said venue.
- Attendees who are sick, experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, or who have a positive COVID test result within ten (10) days of the start of the Summit, are not to attend.
- Attendees who become sick, experience COVID-19 symptoms, or have a positive COVID test result during the Summit should quarantine, are prohibited from attending any events, and should promptly contact Evan Keats ekeats@securecommunitynetwork.org.
- Attendees who choose not to adhere to these protocols will not be able to participate in the Homeland Security Summit and may be restricted from attending future SCN events or activities. SCN employees who violate these protocols will be subject to discipline.
- SCN reserves the right to modify or amend these protocols in response to changing health conditions or legal guidance.
